

East Foundation and the Witte Museum Seek Applicants for the 2022 Land Stewardship Ambassadors Cohort

San Antonio, TX – August 25, 2021 – The Witte Museum has partnered with East Foundation to deploy our fourth cohort of Land Stewardship Ambassadors. This is a 10-week program which will raise awareness of land stewardship principles, promote civic engagement and inspire students to obtain careers that support land stewardship. Through interactive experiences, career exploration and the study of stewardship, the Land Stewardship Ambassadors Program (LSA) teaches students how to be a voice for Texas.

"We are excited to welcome our applicants and answer any questions they might have," said Masi Mejia, educator for the East Foundation and LSA instructor. "This is a great program for anyone who has an interest in the environment, natural resources, veterinary science, and the outdoors. Every year we have great students who go on to do great things not only within natural resources, but other fields like medicine and accounting. Regardless of the field they choose, they become advocates for land stewardship."

A cohort of 15 high school students will be selected in Bexar, Webb, and Cameron Counties. Students from outside these counties are encouraged to apply but should know the meetings will take place in-person and in a central location. The three cohorts will meet separately except for the two overnight trips at The Witte Museum and on the Foundation's San Antonio Viejo Ranch.

Central meeting locations will be as follows: Bexar County cohort meets at the Witte Museum in San Antonio; the Cameron County cohort meets at Camp Rio at Historic Lula Sams in Brownsville; and Webb County cohort will meet at Falcon Bank in Laredo.

The application is now open and can be found at the link provided below. The application deadline will close November 1, 2021. This is a reading and writing intensive course. Semifinalists will participate in a Zoom Interview the week of November 8-12, 2021. Finalists will be notified November 15, 2021. On December 12, 2021, there will be a student-parent informational meeting to prepare for the Spring 2022 Semester.

At the end of the semester-long program, students give a presentation to their peers about a topic related to land stewardship and are awarded a \$400 stipend. The Land Stewardship Ambassadors program is proudly sponsored by Texas Farm Credit.
